Please note the formal Mount Vernon School uniform consists of:

<u>ParentPay</u>



Mount Vernon Primary is now using ParentPay for all school trips, clubs, school meals etc. This will enable us to remove a lot of the cash and cheques from schools. Our system shows that only half of our families have set up a ParentPay account. Please contact our school clerical team who are happy to help guide you through this process.

From April 2022 you can use ParentPay to order/select your child's school meals.

School fundraising still comes directly to the school and not through ParentPay. This allows us to bank this money into the school fund and avoids the service charge taken by ParentPay.

<u>Parentsportal</u>

Education Services linked Parentsportal to our Mount Vernon Primary at the start of November. However, we still have a number of families who have not logged on. Parentsportal will enable schools and parents/carers to manage many of the administration processes more efficiently online. It is available 7 days a week and 24 hours per day.

Parents and carers using Parentsportal must have a MyGov account. You can open a MyGov account online. Parents and carers should use the same login and password details for your MyGov account to log into parentsportal.scot

The first time you access Parentsportal, you are required to make a digital link to your child. This is an essential step to allow you to use Parentsportal. Please login and link to your child's account now. It is essential that we have all your current contact details. If your contact details have changed recently, please advise the school as soon as possible.

We have formed links with the Sakura Cherry Tree Project and been gifted a Japanese Cherry Tree for our Woodland Walkway.




We have also had some much needed maintenance carried out on our Woodland Walkway and the children have been back enjoying this area over the past few days.


